Be it known to all men that I, William Le Scrope, lord of Man and the Isles, am obliged to Richard Whittington, mayor and citizen of London, for £166 2s. 7d., to be paid to the said Richard or his attorneys, by the festival of St Martin next coming [11 Nov. 1393], after which date I will be well and faithfully obliged to the said Richard, as will my heirs and executors, for all my goods in time to come, in witness whereof I have appended my seal, on 29 Aug. 1393.

on the same day,
in the presence of Sir Ralph Tempest,
James Morton, John Constable, and others.

The condition of this obligation is that I, William Le Scrope, should pay, or have payment made, to Richard Whittington, or to his heirs or attorneys, on the festival of St Martin next coming [11 Nov. 1393], £57 [?], and by Christmas nextcoming, £53 6s. 7d., and by the feast of Pentecost [7 May 1394], £62 [*faded*] this obligation [*faded* ...] and any payment in part of the whole amount should be according to this obligation ...
